1. (25:19-26) Isaac marries Rebecca. While pregnant, she is told that two nations are in her womb, and bears twins, Esau and Jacob.
2. (25:27-34) Esau sells his birthright to Jacob for a pot of stew.
3. (26:1-16) Isaac and Rebecca flee famine to Gerar. God renews for Isaac the covenant He made with Abraham. Isaac, fearing the Philistines, says Rebecca is his sister.
4. (26:17-22) Isaac moves to the Gerar valley, but still has problems with the Philistines. He finds a peaceful place to settle and names it Rechovot.

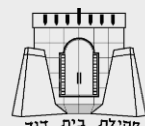
