ABOUT RIVKA AMADO

Rivka Amado was born in Holon Israel, and spent most of her adult life in Jerusalem before moving to Berkeley, California in 2004. She traces her roots back to prominent Sephardic families - the Amado's and the Barbut's - on both sides of her family. After their expulsion from Spain both families eventually found their way to the Balkans where they remained for generations. Rivka's parents made aliyah in 1933. She grew up in a Ladino-speaking home in Holon, where she learned traditional melodies.
