Ḥumash Etz Ḥayim, page 198; Haftarah: Obadiah 1:1-21, page 221

- (32:4-24) Jacob nervously prepares for his meeting with his brother Esau.
- (32:25-33) Jacob wrestles with a "man" and receives from him a blessing and a new name, Israel, at the cost of a lame thigh. Jacob was left alone. And a man wrestled with him until the break of dawn.(Genesis 32:25)
 - o See the commentary to this verse on the question of who the being was, page 201 of Humash Etz Hayim in the d'rash section:
 - Esau's guardian angel
 - The demonic guardian of the river
 - Jacob's conscience, prompting him to face his past as a trickster instead of avoiding the confrontation with Esau
 - A divine messenger to prevent Jacob from running away Himself
 - Another midrashic tradition, however, suggests a more ambiguous identification: "I shall not let you go until you tell me your name." And he called his name Israel like his own (the angel's) name, for his name was Israel." (Pirkei D'Rabbi Eliezer 37)
- (33:1-20) Jacob meets his brother Esau, who receives him warmly. They go their separate ways in peace.
